**The Rotary Clubs of San Marino and South Pasadena** join forces each year, to build a house in a day for a deserving family in Tecate, Mexico. Participants travel to El Cajon and spend the night in a hotel. They meet at a shopping center parking lot on Saturday morning and travel across the border where they met the family that has volunteered hundreds of hours to earn the house along with building materials. Under the supervision of experienced lead builders with Corazon, Inc, the participants construct a 16x20 house which includes a loft, kitchen counter, windows and a door. There is no plumbing or electrical. The house was finished at 5 pm and the keys were turned over to the family in a short ceremony. The participants return to El Cajon where a celebratory fiesta was held. Thirty to fifty volunteers will help with the annual Corazon build. Those who go will get a sense of what it means to have rotary in them, as they will help build a new home in one day. At the end of a productive day the keys to a new home will be given to a thankful family. This is a great opportunity to introduce children, grandchildren, and Interact students to the world of Rotary and hands on service projects.
