We help families like Cecilio's for as little as \$100 which covers the cost of a Shelterkit, or when needed a ShelterBox and family sized tent is still gifted directly to a beneficiary for \$1,000.

Last year, ShelterBox reached 145,000 people in communities devastated by natural disasters or conflict. We were nominated a second straight year for the Nobel Peace Prize, and ShelterBox USA maintained our 4-Star rating on Charity Navigator and Platinum Seal of transparency from Guide Star.

Today there are over 87 million people displaced due to natural disasters and conflict. This is the highest number in recorded history. We still have a big mission ahead and we appreciate your support.
