Benjamin Medvitz Craft Talk

Benjamin is one of our newest members and when asked to do his craft talk, like many before him, he wasn't quite sure what to say, but he approached it with a sense of humor. We learned he just turned 50 and is a 3rd generation Czech, whose father and grandmother were both born in the US. He moved to Villa Park about 21 1/2 years ago with his wife and 3 daughters. He was born in Encino and, at about 2 weeks of age, moved to Houston, where his father got a job as the librarian for the Houston Symphony. He moved back to California at age 11. His older brother was very artistic, but he was more analytical, like his mother; he wanted to know how things worked. He attended Irvine High School and went on to study electrical engineering at UCI. Once in the field, he realized it wasn't what he expected. So he transitioned to software and hardware engineering. He moved into management and went back to UCI to get his MBA. He found his niche as a team leader in the field of electronics use in harsh environments, where he discovered he could explain things to non-engineers in simple, easy to understand language. After graduating from college, he and his brother shared a home in Belmont Shores and during the summer would host large barbecues. At one such event, he met his wife to be. They were married in 2003 and lived in Irvine for 17 years. They needed a bigger home and discovered Villa Park. His oldest daughter is attending Chapman University studying special education. His middle daughter is a junior attending Orange Lutheran High and is an outstanding member of their softball team. His youngest daughter is in 6th grade at Serrano Elementary School. As a child, he never participated in organized team sports, but encouraged his daughters to, because it would help them understand

that accomplishments require learning to work and get along with other individuals. He and his middle daughter are about to embark on a tour of colleges she hopes to attend after her senior year.
