Craft Talk

Les is a retired Veterinarian who has lived in Villa Park with his wife Ardie, and raised their 3 sons, for over 50 years. He also has 6 grandchildren, 4 boys and 2 girls. During his career he developed the concept of the luxury pet hotel, which has become a widespread industry, and the Emergency Veterinarian Hospital, where he is the current president and CEO. He was born when his family lived in Detroit, Michigan and his dad was in the entertainment and hospitality industry; he ran a well known nightclub. Les made the decision to become a veterinarian at age 7 or 8 when he found out his dog, who had been in a kennel during a family vacation, died and broke his heart. After living in Tuscan, Arizona for a while, his family settled in Van Nuys where he attended school. After posting some bad grades his grandmother gave him an attitude adjustment about school and grades. From that time on he became an excellent student. He went on to serve in the Air Force as an Air Evacuation Specialist. Upon leaving the service he met his wife to be, and started his pre and eventual Veterinarian Training at UC Davis-graduating in 1968. He went on to open his own animal hospital and create some innovative concepts for pet owners noted above. Les loves his country and the opportunities it gave him.
