80 million or more individuals in developing countries have mobility issues and need help. To this end, Don Schoendorfer PhD., a biomedical engineer, has developed low-cost wheelchairs and started the Free Wheelchair Mission in 2001. The wheelchairs cost \$96 to build and last 5-8 years. Replacement parts and new chairs are available. Each month, the organization delivers 60,000 wheelchairs to individuals in a number of countries with life-changing results. One of the goals of today's presentation was to spread awareness of the need and see if our club can help fund or partner with other clubs to provide additional chairs.

Text of Kelly McBride's Inspiration

Truth is the guiding light that illuminates our path, the bedrock upon which trust is built. In a world filled with noise and misinformation, embracing the value of truth is more important now than ever before. It is only by seeking and upholding truth that we can foster understanding, build meaningful relationships and create a foundation for better future. Let us remember that truth is not just a concept to be upheld, but a powerful force that has the ability to transform our world for the better.

Let us remember that truth is different for different people in a different context, and that no person or religion has a monopoly on truth. This is why the Rotary 4 -way Test is important to understand what is really truth when it is evaluated for how fair it may be for all concerned, if it will build goodwill and better friendships, and, is it beneficial to all concerned. What may seem to be truth at first glance may not survive these tests and then should be understood not as a moral truth, but merely a convenient one.

For all of us at the Rotary Club of Villa Park, let us pledge to honor moral truth in all our endeavors, because it is the cornerstone of integrity and the catalyst for progress.
