Mark Kammerlohr- My Journey Craft Talk

Mark by his own admission is a product of the Orange Unified School District. He was born in Long Beach, but lived for a while in Norco, before moving to Georgia at age 6. He did move back to California at age 8 and lived in a house at the site of what is now the Ronald McDonald House on Batavia Street in Orange. His grandparents lived in Los Alamitos near the racetrack, and he spent

many summers there. He became interested in youth football at that time and excelled. This fueled his dream to become a professional football player. He played on the Orange High Team, but was set back by a broken arm in his senior year when the team had a 10-3-1 season record. He did go on to play football, and run track at the University of the Redlands, where holds a record there for the triple jump. After starting his studies there as a pre-med, he eventually switched to psychology. He went back to Orange High to help coach football while working on his teaching credential at Chapman University. He also worked as a security guard at Orange High where he first encountered another security guard, Dennis McCuiston. He went on to get his master's degree in counseling and served as an intern at Elmo and Cerro Villa Middle School. He got a job as a counselor at a Las Vegas Middle School where he also started his family- a son and a daughter. He realized that Las Vegas was not a good place to raise a family and moved back to Orange, to become the Vice Principal at Villa Park High (for 4 years), and later, Principal at Richland High. After that he went back to counseling and has been doing that for the last 13-14yrs. He is about to start a 1-year sabbatical to work on a personal growth and development program that he hopes to bring to the schools called, Integrate. He also loves jeep racing and plans to race this summer. He is glad he joined our club and is surrounded by other individuals who have excelled at their careers, but want to give back and make a difference.
