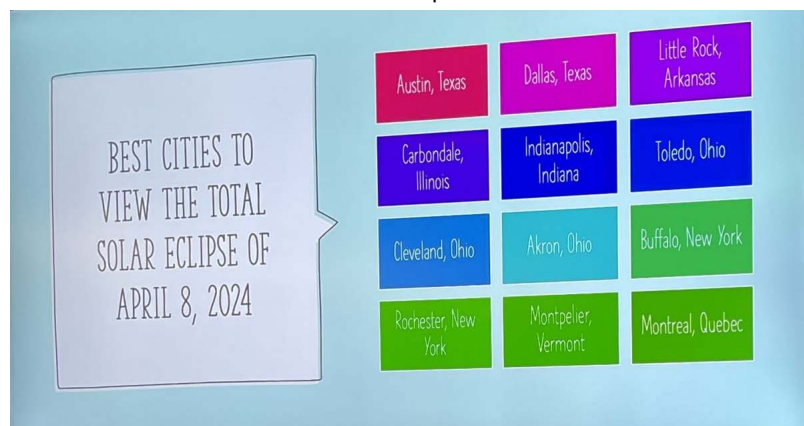

The Confessions of an Amateur Astronomer

Mark is a man of many talents, but his true passion is astronomy. He tells us he first became hooked while listening to a radio interview with Carl Sagan. He knew that that he would need telescopes to better view the heavens. He even put an observatory dome on his Seal Beach Home, causing some anxiety among his neighbors, and ultimately had to be removed. He has traveled the world to see many total solar eclipses. He previewed the next eclipse that will happen on April 8, 2024 and can best be seen from a number of locations listed below. He showed some photos of nebulas he has photographed and photos from prior solar eclipses he has attended. He marveled at the images from the new James Webb Space Telescope, and he continues to be a frequent observer of the night sky.
