Paul Vann- Is off the walker and doing well. He thanked the club for their support during his recovery.

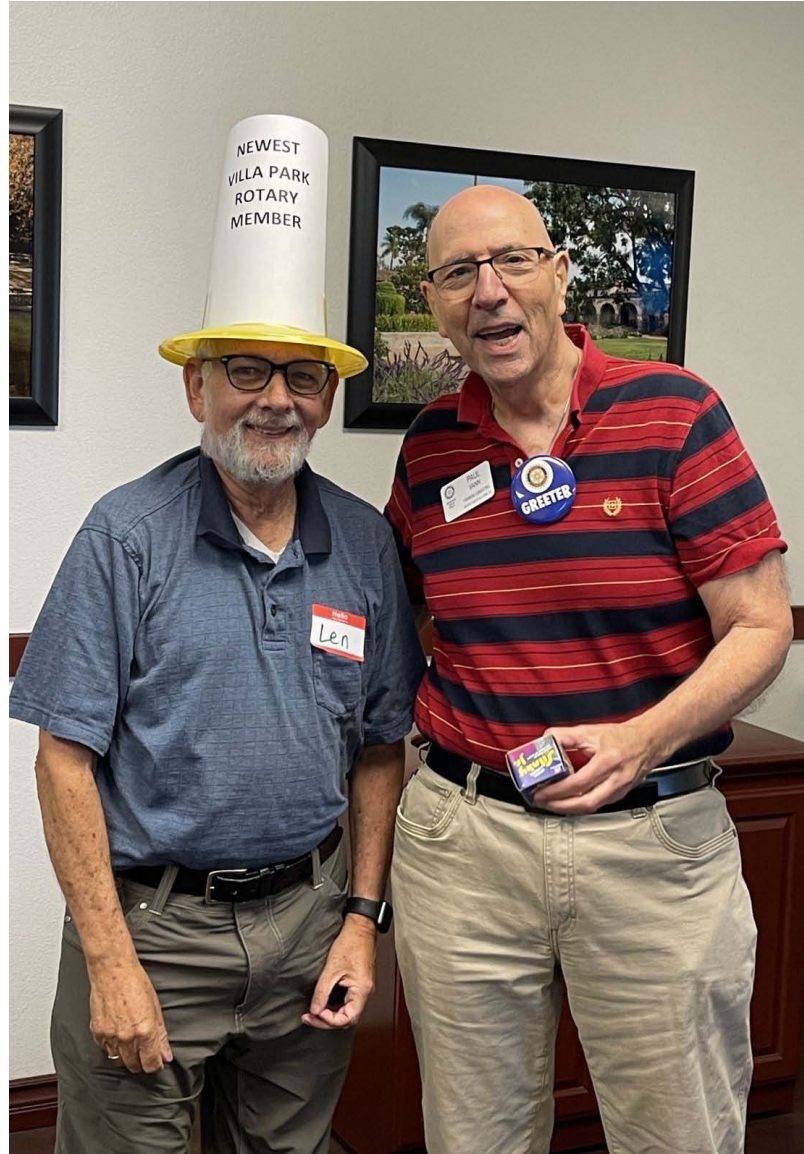
John Valentine-Wants everyone to know that Roy Berelowitz runs a great committee meeting.
