- The American Red Cross must collect nearly 13,000 blood donations every day for patients in need.
- Blood products are perishable and cannot be manufactured; they can only come from volunteer donors.
- 16-year-old students are eligible to donate blood with a signed parental consent.
- Cancer patients use nearly one quarter of the blood supply – more than patients fighting any other disease.
- A single car accident victim can require as many as 100 pints of blood.
- A diverse blood supply is important! A patient is more likely to find a compatible blood match from a donor of the same race or a similar ethnic group.

Bill Gibson OC Beekeeping

Bill began his life-long fascination with bees at the age of 9 or 10 when a neighbor had a hive on their roof. He considers himself a sideline beekeeper with less than 100 hives. He noted that 1/3 of the food grown on the planet requires bees to pollinate the crops. The California Almond Crop requires 2/3 of the country's bee stock to be trucked in from across the country to complete the pollination process that runs from February to mid-March. Commercial beekeepers lose about 43% of their bees annually due to mites, chemical and organic treatments and harsh weather. What was referred to as "colony collapse disorder" was due to the same influences. There are 2 kinds of bees - commercial, where the bees are calm and docile, and feral/wild bees, which are made up of 33% Africanized bees which aggressively defend the hive, Arabian, East and West European bees. Fascinating.
