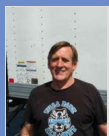

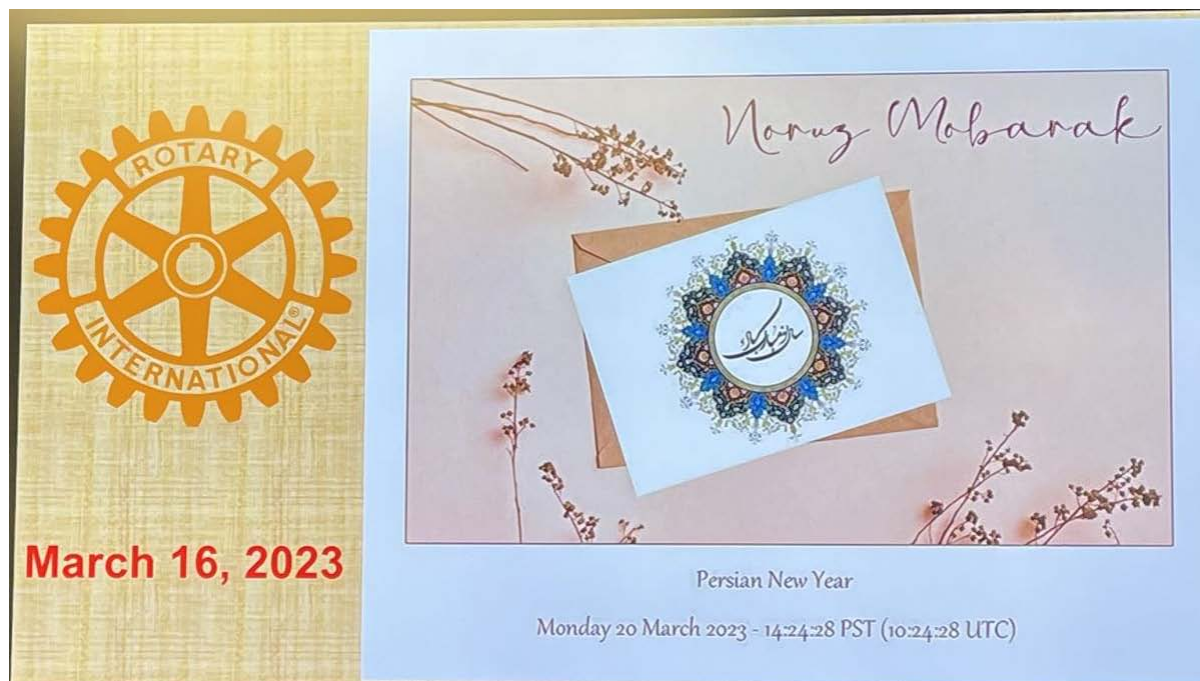

She is also an immigrant who came to this country at age 5. Her parents arrived with little money, but started businesses and her mom became a nurse. She lived in Anaheim Hills from 1995-2018 and hopes to purchase a home in the community. She noted there are many changes at the school and enrollment is up over 10% for credited programs and 8 percent for non-credited programs. The school offers a great opportunity for high school students to take college courses at no charge.

There will be a Presidential Inauguration on May 11th from 4-6 pm, and she wanted to invite us all. The event is a fundraiser with a goal of making \$250,000 to allow continued support for their programs.

Speaker: Youth Protection Training

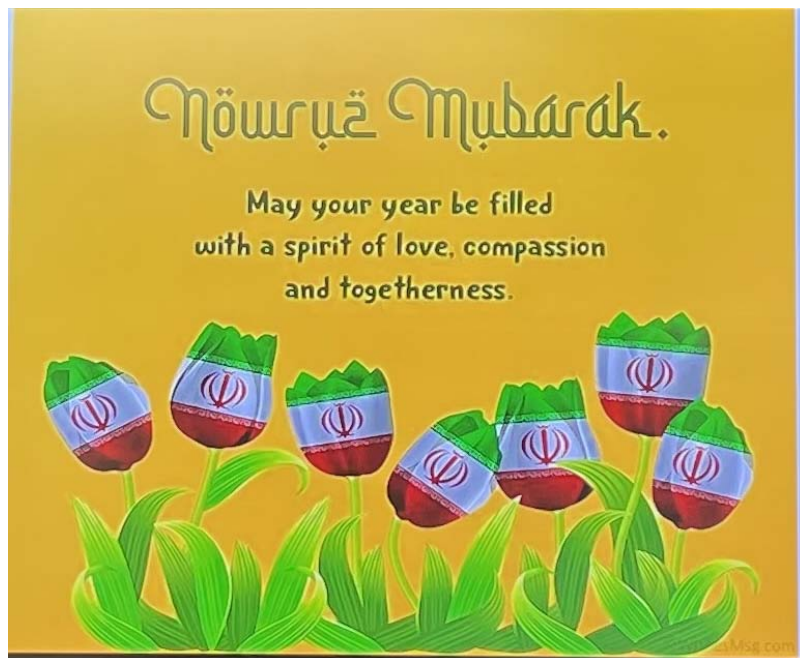

The goal of the program is to make us better Rotarians and help weed out bad actors in our organization and allow us to create a safe environment for youth in our programs. Most of the training is common sense, but requires continued education. Types of behaviors to avoid include: neglect, emotional abuse, physical abuse and sexual abuse/harassment. Abusers tend to use grooming behaviors to win the trust of the victims and their families. This includes: befriending the victim's family, gifts, special treatment. If an event occurs the proper response is to: Remove the offender, insure the child is safe, report the event to the youth protection officer in the club, and notify the parents/guardians. All club members should at least have level 1 training, which includes on-line training and a background check.
