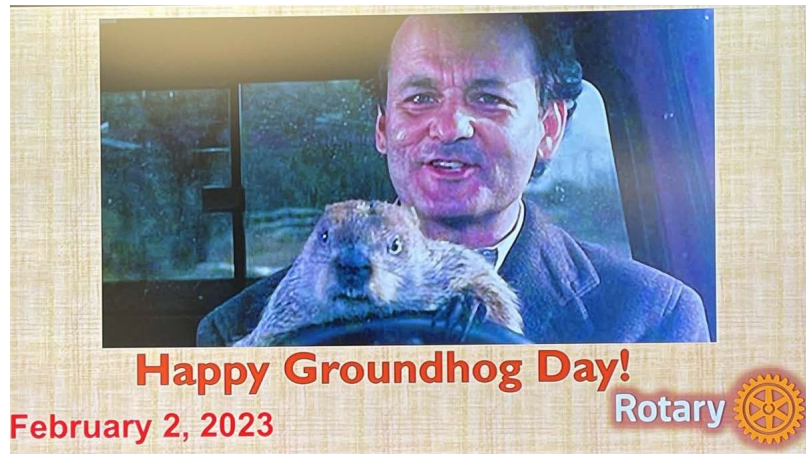

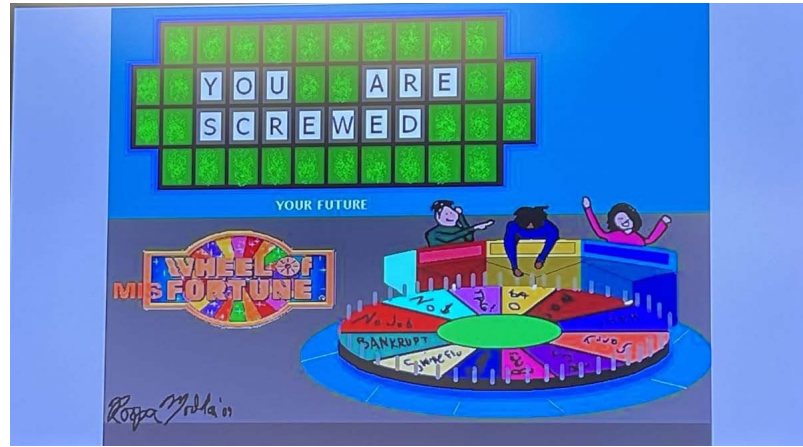

Speaker: Candace Chromy Senior Living Options


Statistics show that between 2010 and 2030 the population of the United States 65+ will double and during that same period those 75+ will increase by 77%. Many of these individual may require assistance with activities of daily living or care for chronic conditions or diseases. This is what has come to be called, "The Silver Tsunami." Candace emphasized that decisions of options should be discussed before a crisis. In recent years the image of nursing homes has changed from sterile and clinical to more home-like. Here are the options she discussed:

Independent Living Facilities-apartments for those 55+; Continuing Care Retirement Communities-require "buy in" and provide a full continuum of care on-site; Assisted living; Memory Care, Skilled Nursing; Hospice-for end of life care. Other options include: Respite Care-short term stays; Home Care-someone cares for you in your own home; and Adult Day Care-daytime only care at a facility. Cost may be a consideration for any of these options. Candace is the director of sales for Sunrise of Orange, a new facility at 1301 E Lincoln Ave, Orange.
