

"Know this, my beloved brothers: let every person be quick to hear, slow to speak, slow to anger." - James 1:19

Active listening builds connections and deepens conversations. Using the A-L-R process makes us more effective in our Rotary mission.

First, **Ask Questions**. Thoughtful questions keep the conversation going and give us a deeper understanding.

Second, **Listen to Understand**. Focus on their perspective instead of thinking about your next response.

Finally, **Reflect and Respond**. Connect with their points by restating, sharing your thoughts, or asking another question.

The benefits of active listening are powerful. It helps us understand others, enhance relationships, persuade effectively, lead teams, and learn from others. Listening is key to achieving our goals and improving our well-being.

Norally & Armando Palomares

This is an organization that provides surgical procedures for the indigenous population in Chiapas, Mexico over the last 12 years. To date, they have provided 12,000 consultations, 6000 life-changing surgeries and 6000 dental procedures, but there is still great need. Each trip costs about \$150,000 and only allows them to do one trip per year. They are in need of donations so they can purchase equipment. They remain committed to providing free medical care, supplies, and medications to those who cannot afford them.
