and we were all proud to work on the progress of our club with Fred. He even had some Real estate leads for me on occasion. He passed on unexpectly and we all felt a profound loss He inspired us greatly. His was the burning desire not to spend the Wiggins memorial fund but to build it to a large amount.

For us to drop our loose pocket change in the brass spittoon each week which morphed into an agreed upon monthly payment on our invoices to eventually be large enough to then to earn interest enough to sponsor some High School/college students that were/are worthy, or other such good causes within the scope of the MV Rotary Club.

He was thinking & working on Rotary all week, not just at the meetings.

He was to the International Convention with Rick Murray in 1991. And probably to others.

He strived to assist each member of the club & especially the incoming Presidents. He was excited about broadening the club with 'lady ' members & sponsored our first –Victoria- who he inspired to be a President of our club, as well.

By unanimous consent, the Doc Wiggins Fund has been renamed the Fred Buckhalter - Doc Wiggins Memorial Fund to honor both outstanding Rotarians who have contributed so much to the growth and value of our club.

The Memorial Fund is a permanent fund and the growth of the fund is through individual voluntary contributions from club members and the interest accrued. The Doc Wiggins Fund was very dear to Fred's heart and he wholeheartedly supported it's concept of continued growth until it reached a point where the interest alone would support some of our club activities such as H.S. Scholarships with the principle to remain intact. It is governed by five past presidents. Fred, What a guy! The Hammer! [Rotary Eulogy by DON WILE given on Friday May 18 at the Presbyterian Church of the Master]

Fred was affectionately known as "the Hammer" within the Rotary club. I should say "<u>his</u>" Rotary club, as the club was extremely important to him and he took it personal if everyone did not share the enthusiasm he applied to every project and task that benefited from his involvement. "The Hammer" nickname came from this enthusiasm to never let up in getting people and tasks moving toward the end objective.

Nothing got put off. With Fred, there is no better time to do something than right now. There is the belief in our club that Fred had changed his personal dictionary by removing the word "procrastination". He drove all of us, at one time or another to over-achieve in spite of our personal time constraints. If Fred said meet me at Esperanza School at 2:00, you better be there at 1:45, because if you were not there, he would be wondering if you forgot, and call to make sure you remembered.

I recall the first pancake breakfast that I worked with Fred. I was the chairman on paper, but I knew who the real chairman was. Fred made sure that I got all the information on prior events and personally went with me at Smart & Final to arrange the supplies and point out what size of container to buy. He handled the ticket production, set up the meetings with the school, sold tickets or should I say pushed tickets on companies and people who bought because a "no" was unacceptable. I got a first hand lesson in what "commitment" means from a master.

So in the second year at the breakfast, I assigned him the duty of mess sergeant. A duty and title that he grabbed on and ran the kitchen with firm love and commitment, making certain that each plate got only two sausages and only two. For sure the Hammer had plenty of love in all that he did. Personally, I believe Fred's hammer applied light taps and instilled his great passion on those that felt the light tap.

Fred was always there to help or advise on any subject. Like on the trip to build a Corazon house last year, the conversation on the way to Mexico got around to family and keeping in contact. Fred asked, Don, do you call your Mother every week? I said no, I didn't. Fred said with his gentle hammer, well start! He said that if you could see how Jean's face lights up when the boys call, I would understand how much those calls mean to a mother. A light tap from the Hammer. Needless to say I returned from that trip and called my Mom. That was Fred. Compassionate, giving, and alive with concern for others.

Everything was pretty black and white in his viewpoints. There were no gray areas. During my year as club president, the phone would ring and chances are it was Fred. Just making sure that I didn't forget to do something, giving advice on what the club had been doing, or what was I doing about some project. Nothing was clearer than, we should do all we can for our Rotary club to fulfill our commitment of "service above self". He will be missed. The laughter and fellowship that his question of the day brought to us will be missed. Supposed to raise money, it somehow always had trouble breaking even. Probably because the answer always somehow seemed to include Michigan. This was vintage Fred, it didn't matter that it didn't raise money, it was all worth it to have people laughing, kidding, alive in the spirit of Rotary.

For Fred, nothing is more important in life than reaching out and touching others lives. We all felt the light tap of his hammer that kept us in focus and on track of our Rotary goals. He is present here to day, a part of each of us he touched in his life.
