



## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

One of our goals this year is to create a more cohesive "one club" atmosphere. We achieved the biggest part of that by establishing a flexible price structure that embraces all current and proposed members.

In order to fully meet the "one club" concept, your board is proposing a name change to better distinguish our club. On Tuesday Aug. 20 and Wednesday Aug. 21, those in attendance will vote yes or no to change our name from "Redlands Sunrise Rotary" to Redlands Sunrise & Sunset Rotary." We believe this better defines our one-club structure. We estimate costs associated with the change (including new flyers, promotional items, website update, feather banner, name banners, office supplies, etc.) to be \$3000+/- . Jim Bacca will lead the transition, with board assistance. (The redesigning and rewrapping of the Read for Life Trailer will proceed due to sponsorship changes, etc. regardless of Club name).

The Board recommends a YES vote for changing the club's name from "Redlands Sunrise Rotary" to "Redlands Sunrise & Sunset Rotary."

## PREVIOUS MEETING NOTES

Gabe Brown presented a summary of the membership survey conducted in February, measuring members' views on a variety of subjects including Values, Satisfaction, Club Culture, Membership Experiences, Service Work, Fundraising, and Club Collaboration.

70% of members responded which validates the conclusions of the survey analysis. The survey highlighted interesting responses. A quarter of club members would like more local projects, while half would like to see more international projects; half the members would like to see more fundraising for projects; and half of the members would like to see a more diverse club. The group discussed how we might increase public awareness of Rotary and the diversity of RSR compared to our community. Members would like to collaborate with other service clubs and do more work internationally. For instance, Rafael is in Honduras this week to work on a project initiated by the Florida Lake Wales Rotary club. And we are invited to participate with the Palm Springs SunUp club building a house for a family in Tecate, Mexico.
