Morning

Rich Sessler joined the City of Redlands as a firefighter in 2005. He moved up through the ranks becoming Battalion chief in 2014 and deputy Fire Chief in 2018 and Fire Chief in 2022. The Fire Department leads the community in Public Safety. They receive over 12,000 calls a year. Number of calls goes up by about 5% each year. They have 70 employees.

Station 262 Remodel: A big step in investment and progress is the remodel of State 262 at 1690 Garden Street. They are remodeling to accommodate female firefighters.

Emergency Management: The emergency management of the city of Redlands is managed by the Fire Department. They coordinate the Emergency Notification System for the city.

Confire: Confire consists of all the local fire departments working together as a team Redlands Fire Department has a contract to run the Ambulance Service for all the neighboring cities.
