Craft Talk with Bob Barton

Bob, musician extraordinaire, has a BA in music from UCLA and a MA from Chapman College. He has spent 39 years teaching music in the Fontana School District moving around between teaching Elementary and Middle School-aged children.

He joined the Military National Guard in 1996 and spent 25 years in the Air Force Band playing the French horn. Following 9/11, he was deployed for airport security and then in 2005 to New Orleans to help with clean up after Hurricane Katrina.

Bob explained to us that Prop 28, Arts and Music in Schools, brought \$1 billion to the schools. It must be spent on new things, with 80% going to staff and 20% going to supplies. Bob is retired but currently works a few days training new teachers.
