Jimmy presented a comprehensive update on the latest developments with ShelterBox and the club's history with the organization. The organization was created as a Rotary project in the year 2000. It was Rotary's first Partner Project in 2012. The organization focuses on the most remote disasters where aid does not normally reach. They have built a highly effective, geographically distributed model for contracting, warehousing, and distributing their disaster resources so that they can respond quickly and efficiently to disasters as they occur. The organization has also moved beyond the original boxes and standardized resources to meet the unique needs of the local communities effected by disasters more effectively.
