PRESIDENTS MESSAGE

Hello, my Redlands Sunrise Rotary FAMILY,

I certainly never wish to be described as all doom and gloom, and while "Ignorance Can Be Bliss" I have been asked by a number of you to keep the updates coming as they pertain to the Rotary PEACE Initiative and world affairs. The information I receive and pass along is derived from various friends, business associates and reliable sources who travel internationally and transact business in countries many will not visit in their lifetime. I merely wish to keep all you and your loved ones aware of what is occurring outside the "Redlands Bubble".

This goes without saying but we are in great hands with our Police Department and Chief Tolber who has her finger on the pulse... The Redlands Police Department coined a phrase some years back which holds true to our Community today: "If You See Something, Say Something". While Dispatch is busy, they will always answer your calls.

Here is a brief synopsis of geo-political happenings. As most of you are aware, there is a major war in Israel that threatens to engulf much of the Middle East. The global implications are not just for Israel but very much for the United States. The ongoing War in Ukraine has not subsided in the least, and yes, the world can be a dangerous place. Less noticed by most media outlets is the prospect of another war brewing in Kosovo, that would immediately bring in NATO and the United States. There continues to be provocations in the air and at sea by an increasingly unstable and economically challenged China who believe wholeheartedly they will be the next world superpower.

The enemies of the Western dominated system of finance, trade and "international law" are now openly calling themselves an "Axis", reminiscent of a world eight decades back. In short, the world is becoming a far more sinister place than most of us even realize. Beyond the military and "battlespace dynamics" are fundamental economics and supply chain considerations underlying the stunning military engagements, and growing threats to our global lines of communications. Further, virtually unprecedented levels of anti-Semitic acts coinciding with the War in Israel have also dramatically increased the threat of terrorism or violent extremism here at home. Threats to critical infrastructure here in the United States, both physical and virtual, have moved into a new sphere of concern, which ties into re-thinking mitigation and preparedness strategies. Again, this is by no means intended to frighten anyone, just facts that I believe directly impact the concept of PEACE which doesn't always fit into a nice, neat box. Continue to SPEAK PEACE and yes, education is a true component of the PEACE LANGUAGE.

Going forward, I would humbly suggest we all remain aware of our surroundings and be prepared as one would for an earthquake or any other natural disaster. Plan ahead of time for you and your loved ones. Never be afraid to broach topics which some may find uncomfortable but factually accurate. If nothing more, consider this a friendly reminder that is okay to think outside the box which is what we as Rotarians due on a regular basis.

As always to our Police Officer's, Firefighter's, and Military, THANK YOU for all you do. It does not go unnoticed.


HAPPY DOLLARS RECOGNITION
