FEBRUARY WAS “BARE ESSENTIALS” DRIVE MONTH AT THE CVRM!!!

Last year our club members and guests brought in over 200 items to be used by the mission!!!

This year we **MORE THAN DOUBLED** our donations with 377 pairs of underwear, 36 T-shirts, 3 bras, and 17 pairs of socks for a total of 433 items!!!



President Bruce thanked everyone for participating in the annual “Bare Essentials” Drive in February and for their generous donations! This year, together, we more than doubled last year’s donations bringing in 433 items to be used both at the mission and with the Outreach program to help clothe those less fortunate and homeless this spring!



March was our semi-annual “Mac Attack” Drive for the Rescue Mission in which our members and guests were asked to bring Macaroni and Cheese items. We did a GREAT JOB on this one last August bringing in 396 items. Our goal this month was to exceed 400 items! A final tally showed that this month we met our goal bringing in 402 Mac and Cheese items!!! This is really a fan favorite both at the mission and through their Outreach programs as these items are not only used at the mission itself, but they are also distributed to families in need across our valley and really make a positive impact on those less fortunate individuals right here in our own community! Way to go Rotary Club of La Quinta, your President is so proud of you!!!

APRIL IS OUR "TOILETRY" DRIVE

Guest Speaker: DISTRICT 5330 GOVERNOR JAMIE ZINN March 14, 2024

Finally, it was time for our program. President Bruce introduced our speaker, District 5330 Governor Jamie Zinn. President Bruce began, "Jamie Zinn is the Chief Operating Officer of a major Western U.S. distribution firm and a proud Rotarian for over 17 years. She served on the RI Designated 5330 World Peace Conference as Treasurer and is a Co-Founder and Director for the Solutions for Peace Foundation. She has served as a Club President, as well as Treasurer, Secretary, and Chair for Foundation, Membership, Public Relations, Vocational, Community Service and Club Administration. She has been Treasurer and a Director for District 5330 since 2013. Jamie has been recognized as the California Businesswoman of the Year in 2005 and 2006 as well as recipient of the Congressional Medal of Distinction in 2006 and 2008 for her work with the Business Advisory Council on taxation. She is currently a proud member of the Mountain Sunrise Rotary Club and has been recognized as the Rotary International Four Avenues of Service Award Recipient in 2008, Rotarian of the

Year in 2010/2011 and 2011/2012, Lake Arrowhead Rotary Club Presidents Award Recipient in 2009/2010 and District 5330 Rotary Award of Excellence Recipient for 2013/2014. Jamie is an RLI Graduate, Paul Harris Fellow, Bequest Society Member, Benefactor and Major Donor. It is my great honor to introduce our 2023-2024 District 5330 Governor Jamie Zinn". Jamie then received a standing ovation as she approached the podium.

Prior to her visit to our club, DG Jamie asked President Bruce to nominate two outstanding Rotarians for her to present her "Service Above Self" awards to at this meeting. This was a particularly difficult choice for the president as we have so many outstanding members in our club who deserve such an award. For our Rotary Club of La Quinta one of our primary emphasis and areas of focus has always been on our Youth Services. This year there have been two Rotarians that have really distinguished themselves by their amazing efforts and deeds in service to the Youth in our Community and President Bruce submitted their names to DG Jamie for this very special award.

After her brief introductory remarks and thank yous, DG Jamie introduced her first recipient of her Service Above Self Award.



DG Jamie began "The first recipient of my Service Above Self award is Frank Ceja. He is a current member of the Rotary Club of Coachella, he is a past president, and has been involved in Rotary for nearly 20 years. He teaches the Information Technology Academy at La Quinta High School where he is the Faculty Advisor for our newly re-established Interact Club. Frank has done a truly amazing job recruiting students and teaching the students about Rotary, Service Above Self, and the 4-way test. It is due to Frank's dedication and hard

work that LQHS once again has an Interact Club. He is doing a GREAT JOB mentoring these students and most certainly deserves this great honor.”



DG Jamie continued, “The second recipient of my Service Above Self award is Simon Moore. Simon is a recent transfer Rotarian who is now a member of the Rotary Club of La Quinta. He has been involved in Rotary for over 10 years and is a Past President from both the Victorville and Palm Desert Sunset Clubs and is a past member of the Palm Springs Rotary Club. He teaches the Health Academy at the Coachella Valley High School. Simon is responsible for putting together the Town Hall Meeting that took place on March 7, 2024, at the Annenberg Center regarding Fentanyl Awareness and Risk Reduction Strategies where over 250 students from 5 Coachella Valley High Schools attended and learned more about this deadly drug and epidemic. The Rotary Club of La Quinta is extremely proud of your efforts and feel that you truly deserve to be recognized and to receive this great honor.”

DG Jamie then shared with the audience about all the improvements and changes that were taking place at the district to improve the district’s ability to better support the clubs (and their members) at the district level. The District Governor Line has been working together with approximately 30 individual Rotarians from different clubs throughout the district to improve their website and educational opportunities as well as support groups and mechanisms to assist club’s officers and members to be the best Rotarians that they can be.


DG Jamie then shared her AH-HA moment in helping a disabled young woman to experience skiing again with her friends in our local mountains. An AH-HA moment is something which all Rotarians experience at one point or another and

in different ways that galvanizes their belief in Rotary and the knowledge that through Rotary they are making a positive difference in the lives of those less fortunate, whether it be in their own community or around the world. She invited members of the audience to share their AH-HA moment and Frank Ceja volunteered his regarding the 4-way test.
