Next came the delicious White Bean Italian Minestrone Soup with white beans, green beans, carrots, celery, onions, butternut squash and tomatoes. Our vegetable this evening was an amazing Roasted Garlic Broccolini... so simple, but I could have eaten a whole plate of it! And of course we had to have some cheesy bread sticks to stir our soup with!!!




It was then time for President Bruce to name this month's Rotarian of the Month. Each ROM receives a special pin, certificate, and 100 Paul Harris Points.



Finally, it was time for our program. President Bruce introduced our Club's Rotary Foundation Chairman Dr. Bruce Underwood who made the formal introduction of Helene A. Kalfuss Ph.D. Dr. Bruce began, "Helene is a retired Speech Pathologist who earned her Bachelors, Masters, and Doctoral degrees at Wayne State University in Detroit. She had a distinguished career that included Assistant Professor in the College of Medicine and Chief of Audiology and Speech Pathology at the Veteran's Administration Hospital in Dearborn, Michigan, and Director of the Camarillo State Hospital Children's Speech and Language Clinic prior to opening a private practice here in Palm Springs.

Helene is a past president of the Rotary Club of Palm Springs and is currently a member of the Rotary Club of Cathedral City. She is now a full-time Rotarian with a Rotary Resume that includes Past District Governor 2006-2007, District Global Grants chair, Group Discussion Leader and staff at RYLA, training facilitator at RLI and PETS, Literacy Resource Coordinator for Zone 26... honestly, a list of Rotary accomplishments so long we wouldn't have time for the program tonight if I read them all!

Helene has traveled the world as a guest speaker at both clubs and Rotary International Conventions in addition to her global humanitarian efforts as a Rotarian. She has been awarded the *Citation for Meritorious Service* from The Rotary Foundation, the *Service Above Self Award* from Rotary International and the coveted *Distinguished Service Award* from The Rotary Foundation.

Before I ask Helene to come up to the podium I want to acknowledge her husband Leonard of 58 years who is also with us tonight. He has been a Rotarian for 40+ years and has a resume almost as impressive as Helene's!

It is my great honor to introduce to you Dr. Helene A. Kalfuss..."



Helene is probably one of the most dynamic speakers that we we have had the honor to receive at our club this year. She may well be the ultimate autority on the Rotary Foundation. Afterall, she and her husband Leonard have traveled all over the world partcipating in and observing the implementation of Rotary Grant Funds... and she had the slides to prove it. She made a powerful presentation constantly driving home the point that all these projects were the results of Rotarians and "OUR" dollars raised through our dues, donations and participation in the Rotary Foundation. Fifty cents may not even buy a pack of gum here in the U.S., but it will buy 6 doses of Malaria Tablets... Sixty cents will buy 1 dose of the polio vaccine. \$50 to \$75 will buy a prosthetic arm or leg that will help someone to walk upright and/or become a productive member of their society. The point being that no contribution is too small to have a dramatic effect on someone's life! Water projects, hunger projects, cataract and facial surgical operations, education projects and more. Some of Helene's slides were hard to look at... mostly the "before" slides as the "after" slides were nothing short of miraculous, and all thanks to Rotarians and our participation in the Rotary Foundation. I wish I could convey the amazing feeling of pride in being associated with Rotary that everyone in the room left feeling by the end of Helene's presentation. It was truly a stiring and impactful presentation and we Thank You Helene for sharing it with us on this evening.



In addition to her flowers and speaker gifts, President Bruce presented Helene with a Certificate of Appreciation from our Club for her Service Above Self and shared with her that all of us from the Rotary Club of La Quinta acknowledge and appreciate all of her sacrifices, hard work and continued efforts on behalf of Rotary... and that she HAS made the world a better place. President Bruce then thanked the members, special guests, visiting Rotarians, and friends in attendance this evening for their help and support throughout the year and wished everyone safe travels before the reciting of the "Four Way Test" and adjourning the meeting.

It was another wonderful evening spent with fellow Rotarians, spouses, guests, and both new and old friends in the spirit of Rotary.

As Rotarians, our main goal is Peace on Earth. Together, approximately 1.4 million Rotarians are working daily toward this goal by helping to improve the lives of those less fortunate in our own communities and around the world.
