Our speakers this evening were Angela Allen and Diane Rayes from Mama's House. After introducing Angela with her short Bio (read above), president Bruce shared with the group that this year our club is hoping to expand our community service outreach to specifically include another one of Rotary's 7 areas of focus... that being Maternal and Child Health. With the assistance of RCLQ Members Kimberly McKinney and Sandra Lauer, Mama's House was selected to be considered by the Club to become a strategic partner much in the same way that our club currently assists the CVRM with our monthly drives. As such, our members and special guests were keenly interested to learn more about Mama's House and how we could be of help.







Angela began her presentation with a Canva presentation (link below) (https://www.canva.com/design/DAGKfPc6UHA/0iCj1jkYAlkC5Aw6-

edium=link&utm source=editor) sharing an overview of Mama's House and their main goal of helping pregnant women and mothers with infant and/or small children in crisis by offering them a Pathway to Success Program that includes group housing, spiritaual guidance, rehabilitation, education, life skills and everything necessary to help these women/families to integrate back into our community. She explained that clients stay for up to one year and that their current facility houses 10 women plus their babies/infants and that Mama's House is barely scratching the surface to meet the demand that currently exists here in our Valley.



Angela then shared with us that Mama's House was growing with the near completion of their new Campus that would allow them to quadruple the number of mothers with babies and/or small children that they serve!







Diane Rayes followed Angela with her presentation which included a You Tube Video (https://youtu.be/yf6Sqms5PG8?si=dJ3V8LaqcGqixTRO) and a more detailed description of the Pathways to Success Program with actual examples and success stories of several women who had successfully completed their program. Both Angela and Diane were excellent speakers and patiently (and expertly) answered questions from the audience. It was obvious that Mama's House and their mission really resonated with many of our members and special guests and that our getting involved with these folks now would be perfectly timed as they are currently expanding their facilities and services and they could surely use our help and support. Having learned more about Mama's House and having received a list of ways and items needed from Angela, President Bruce assured everyone that a plan to help Mama's House would be formulated at the next Club Board Meeting (Friday, August 23rd at Burgers and Beer La Quinta at 12:00 noon) and shared at our next dinner meeting on September 12th.


