Speaker: Bob Firring introduced Larry Boyd, now on staff with the "local USO†volunteer program. Mr. Boyd

served 17 years enlisted in the Air Force, getting his aeronautical engineering degree for the Air Force,

and working with their GPS satellite program prior to his retirement. He worked for Lockheed out of the

Colorado Springs area before wintering and relocating to our valley. He began as a volunteer with our

local USO and now serves in their staff leadership position.

The USO supports military members and their families, focusing their energies on active duty, national

guard reserves, the retired and gold star families. They are not the same as a veteranâ \in TMs organization.

There are volunteer opportunities with the USO at the PS Airport, at the base at 29 Palms and at Camp

Wilson. Camp Wilson is the desert training facility and officer training facility on the greater Marine

Corp base near 29 Palms. Any facility that might exist called Camp Wilson is skeletal, desert wilderness

about 30 minutes from the base.

USO sites are open solely to the military 18 and over, their families, staff, and volunteers of USO. No

one else can enter the USO. The volunteers offer respite, transitional services, events, and fundraising.

USO's individual sites are now under the umbrella of Corporate USO. All sites funds are raise for the greater

group including USO sites on air craft carriers. Name most any big corporation and you will find a

contributor to the USO effort. The NFL funded tickets, travel, food and lodging for those who won the

international internal electronic gaming competition.

The PS site is open 6 AM-9 PM and overnight with notice to help those needing to catch early AM flights.

Wi-Fi, TV, sleeping room, game room, showers, and access to military information computers plus snacks, sandwiches and hot dogs are offered.

For Camp Wilson, the site will transport a meal, a chance to watch the super bowl, games, and karaoke out to the desolate site for troop respite.

This next year, the local chapter is linking with guide dogs of the desert to provide fostering future guide

dogs for a year by families at the base; expand the electronic gaming competition, and bring back live entertainment to the US local sites.

It is easy to volunteer, check out the USO website, follow the path through the site to volunteering in

Palm Springs and you will catch up with Larry Boyd on line.
