Speaker: Ray Truillo, with the City of Indio and the Department Head for the Indio Water Authority spoke about electricity in the City of Indio.

Rayâ€[™]s early employment history specific to moving water aids in his understanding and work with both water and electricity with the City of Indio. In late 1992, 35% of the state electricity was created by the movement of water, not so today. The biggest issue today is money.

In 1934, CVWD contracted with IID to supply electrical power to residents of CV, including Coachella, Indio, now La Quinta, parts of east Palm Desert and surrounding county areas. That 100-year contract expires 1/1/2033. IID also serves the full county of Imperial and receives 60% of its revenue from the CV.

In basic terms, a power plant generates power that uses step-up transformers to generate transmission to SUBSTATIONS, which then distributes it to transformers and into homes. We lack substations to serve the valley and especially support new development. The substations are tapped out and it costs big money to build more. Part of the problem was the growth in the 2000s resulting in over building, with an economic

collapse that reduced income and stranded the IID investment.

There is no pool of money in IID to improve infrastructure/SUBSTATIONS. The arrival of electric vehicles is impacting the issue as a TESLA charging station uses as much poser as a Walmart store.

In November 2023, the City of Indio started a surcharge to Indio usersâ \in TM of 1/2 cent per KWH. It is on your power bill and called Indio Electric Surcharge, it is static as based on your usage. That money is routed to the city which is committed to use that money to build 4 substations. The first one has been ordered, it takes 3 years to receive, thus it will be here in 2 years.

If you are seeing large fluctuations in your bill, it is probably the ECA which is a surcharge to IID to cover the cost of gas to run the power plants/structure of the distribution chain.
