Bob Firring introduced Kate Anderson, the Director of Public Relations with the Agua Caliente Band of Cahuilla Indians. The tribe dates back 8000 years in the valley and includes 9 tribes or Sovereign Nations. It has opened a new Cultural Plaza in Palm Springs which includes the original, and updated spa served by hot mineral waters bubbling forth some 12000 years following the Ice Age. It is now called Sec'he (the sound of boiling water) and represents 5 generations of a spa in that spot since the 1880s. The springs come out of the ground at 105 degrees and at 26 gallons per minute.

The plaza includes a new museum, including a creation movie, baskets and ollas, tools found beneath the construction site (causing a 6-month delay while an archeology site worked to clear the ground of tribal artifacts), a store selling the work of Native American artists and businesses noting that 1% of US population today can meet the tribal rules to be counted for in membership with a tribe.

Also within the Agua Caliente Nation there is Indian Canvons with waterfalls and
