#### The Rotary Club of Indio Meeting Minutes of October 8, 2024

**Visitors:** Phillip Jones, Mark's guest and considering membership, Ms. Tamara Wadkins, the new PIO for DSUSD and Ms. Ernestina Frias, the director of the Media Center with DSUSD who was our liaison for much of our Third Grade Book Distribution project this Fall.

**Opening:** President Dennis Sheehan opened the meeting. Don Casper led in the salute to our flag, Bryan Montgomery led in the 4-way test and Stacy Fifield managed the Gaboon.

#### **Announcements:**

- 1. Dennis thanked Sue Steding and Martha Mendez, who along with Chris Pickering served on the ad hoc audit committee.
- 2. Ben advised that the Golf Ball Drop is confirmed for Saturday November 9 at Center Stage area in Indio at Miles and Smurr. The BBQ event begins at 1 and ends at 9 with the joint ball drop (The Rotary Club of Indio and the Rotary Club of Coachella Valley) fundraiser for these two clubs happening between 3 and 4. There will be 500 tickets for the club to sell to support our share of the split.
- 3. Mark reported about 50 students appeared at the first Interact meeting at SHHS. More than enough volunteered to pack food boxes with Fine Food bank. Dennis noted that Mark and Dennis will be part of an event to advise seniors of how our college scholarship program works on October 9.
- 4. The club will not be formally participating in the Palm Desert Golf Cart Parade this year.
- Mark your calendars to volunteer to support our biggest fundraiser of the year, the Tour De Palm Springs with set up on Friday February 7, 2025 and coordinating the walk on Saturday the 8<sup>th</sup>.
- 6. Mark your calendars for the club's holiday party at the Dolan home on Sunday December 8 from 4-7.

**Speaker:** Bob Firring introduced Chief of Indio Police, Brian Tully. Chief Tully took the non-traditional route to law enforcement, starting in the insurance business in his native home of San Bernardino and working as an LE reserve. He transitioned to LE via the San Bernardino Sheriff's Academy and served as an officer in that area's community prior to coming to IPD 7 years ago. He was promoted to Chief 6 months ago. With him was Officer Chris Schwartz and canine Argos.

Chief Tully is proud of the city's commitment to recruiting officers from within the Coachella Valley, offering the funding for an academy, equipment, hotel, and food for the 6-month academy either at Riverside, San Bernardino, or San Diego. This investment of over \$10,000.00 per recruit draws in folks interested in LE but without the ability to go on their own. The city has positions for 85 officers with 75 on board and 6 in an academy. They are slowly recovering from NO recruiting during the pandemic.

Chief credits their community policing advocacy for their drop in violent crimes and their drop in theft/property crime although other cities have experienced an increase in the latter because of new sentencing restructures in the state. Building loyalty from within and to the community and good staffing deployment secures the downward


