

Ben spoke about his family history from a small town in Mexico where Mexican Revolutions made it unsafe to stay in the area, to finding a home in the Coachella Valley when they arrived here in 1919.

His family knew farming, so began share cropping in the Desert. They were able to make it through the Depression by raising what they needed & trading with others in the area. At one time they farmed everything from Ave 48 to Van Buren.

The 60's & 70's found cotton as a major crop. First hand picked, then machine picked by huge combines. The Guitron's were diverse crop farmers who raised many different crops. Ben is named after his grandfather. Ben's parents so loved their Father that they each decided to name one of their children Ben. So, there are a lot of Ben's in his family.

- Avi has kindly provided the above link to a "live†schedule that will hold your name in the shift you have signed up for.
- The sign-up sheet is two pages. Please focus on the first page as these are the shifts the Rotary Club of Coachella needs the most help.
- You will see I signed up for one shift each day. I want you all to know I am IN IT. (My father always told me "Don't ask anyone to do something you are not willing to do.) If you and another member prefer that particular shift and location, I will switch to another one.
- At each ENTRANCE cash or credit card is received. Each EXIT is only directing traffic if you really don't want to have to handle money.
- Joe Ceja From the Rotary Club of Coachella Valley will train everyone on using the hand-held device we use to accept credit cards. This same device will "spit out†receipts regardless if paid cash or card.

FOLLOWING ARE THINGS TO KEEP IN MIND AND SOME GOOD IDEAS:

- Each Shift is 4 hours and 15 minutes. The 15 minutes is to allow overlap on shift changes. An individual can sign up for half of a shift. You can work with someone to do the other half.
- If 2 members work the same shift (which is suggested) our club will still receive \$150.00. We receive \$150.00 per SHIFT, not per PERSON.
- If you commit to a shift YOU ARE EXPECTED TO BE THERE. If Life Happens, and you make it, please find a replacement! If that is impossible, contact Barbara Dreis 760-989-2440.
- Once we commit to a shift, we must cover that shiftâ&;Rain, Sleet, or Snow! We will keep our fingers crossed we have mild weather all the way!
- Bring a chair, water and snacks for yourself. If you select a night shift, bring a flashlight for yourself.
- We suggest you dress in layers as weather changes throughout the hours.

I did my best to try and think of everything, but no doubt I have left something out or made something more confusing than needed to be. So, please contact me for any questions or concerns. I did participate last year as the AG for the Coachella Club, so I do have some actual experience for reference.


