Kriston grew up in the Palm Springs area, she is a Rotarian & is also on the Desert Water Agency.

Income from the Angel View Thrift Stores helps to support their mission. They are a nonprofit serving children and adults with disablilities.

Clients live in Angel View Homes.

- 16 homes with 4 bedrooms each in the Desert Hot Springs, & Thousand Palms area
- 2 facilities are Kosher
- 5 are nursing facilities
- 1 is Congregate Living

They all have 24 hour care. Nursing care varies depending on the needs of the facility. Clients can stay their entire life.

California requires Active Treatments to reach their full potential. Clients 22 & over are taken by bus every day to the Day Care Program. Those able to work are taken to Desert Arc. The Day Care Program takes them to Dr appointments, has training, serves meals, has programs to meet their needs.

On week-ends the Clients have outings to parks, etc. Palm Springs Rotary Club sponsors a Prom every year for the Clients.

Angel View also has an Outreach Program now for Clients that are remaining at home. Angel View provides transportation to Dr appointments, mini grants for special needs, a representative that attends IEP meetings at schools, etc.

All of these programs add up to about a \$36 Million Budget. Funding comes from the Thrift Stores, State & Federal Programs, SSI, special needs trusts, grants, & individual donations.

Clients apply through Inland Regional.




Organizations take lead on training for new lifesaving opioid antagonist
