


Desert Wildlife Center Grand Opening!



Paul Harris Recognition Points

How to see your Paul Harris Recognition Points on your personal RI account.



To see your personal Donor History Report: The overview tab is a one page summary of your status. The detail tab shows every TRF (The Rotary Foundation) donation that you have made and also any recognition points that you have received or given away. The PDF combines both tabs into one file.

On the one page summary, there are three sets of numbers of interest.

In the upper right corner, the "PHF Recognition Amount" is the grand total of your cash donations plus any Recognition Points you have received.

Also in the upper right corner, the "Foundation Recognition Points" are points you earned (one dollar donation gets you one point) that are available to give to someone else.

(Many Rotarians, as their cash donations build up points, then transfer points to spouses, or children, or grandchildren, or anyone else. It takes 1,000 points to make someone else a Paul Harris Fellow. There are a lot of spouses and children of Rotarians who are Paul Harris Fellows.

Our club, Riverside East, just gave 1,000 points to Mark Godfrey, a non-Rotarian who works with us on our Show and Go car show. We will be presenting him with this honorary Paul Harris Fellow award at the car show this May 3rd.)

The third set of interesting numbers is in the middle of the page. The "Total Giving" number is the grand total of your actual cash donations to the Foundation.


(Some people give to the annual fund (where the DDF dollars eventually come from) and also to PolioPlus. The breakdown of those numbers is above the "Total Giving" line,)

This "Total Giving," which is all cash, no points added in, is what qualifies as Major Donor status -- \$10,000 cash, not points.
