
Speaker for Tuesday, May 21

Eric J. Ornelas, Communications Specialist with the Annenberg Foundation Trust at Sunnylands will be speaking tomorrow.



Founded in 1970, The Living Desert Zoo and Gardens is a non-profit zoo and botanical gardens specializing in the deserts of the world. It is home to over 500 animals representing 150 species and welcomes over 500,000 visitors annually. The Living Desert's mission is desert conservation through preservation, education and appreciation and it has been recognized as one of the top 10 zoos in the country. Programs provide environmental education, native wildlife rehabilitation, plant propagation, habitat restoration and breeding African, Australian and North American species including desert bighorn sheep. Telling us more about these programs and more on May 28 will be Lin Conrad, The Living Desert's Adopts Program Development Gift Officer. Following graduation from UC Berkeley, Lin lived and worked in the Bay Area for the next 50 years before cold weather and horrible traffic brought her to the Coachella Valley. Her position at The Living Desert is her fourth career following stints as a high school teacher, small business owner and CEO of California Clubs of Distinction. She says of her current occupation, "If only I'd discovered this career years ago!" Lin and her husband Jerry live at Sun City Shadow Hills.


