## May 21 – Sunnylands, A Desert Gem

Eric J. Ornelas, communications specialist with the Annenberg Foundation Trust at Sunnylands, will be with us on May 21. Sunnylands, the 25,000 square foot winter home of Walter and Leonore Annenberg, was completed in 1966. It sits on 200 acres in Rancho Mirage and the estate has entertained eight U.S. presidents and welcomed scores of world leaders since its completion. Prior to their deaths, the Annenbergs created a trust to insure the estate was maintained and to establish it as a private, high-level retreat center. Guided tours of the historic estate are offered to the public. The Sunnylands Center and Gardens, which sits on 15 acres adjacent to the estate, was completed in 2011 and is open to the public free of charge. Eric Ornelas joined the Annenberg Foundation Trust in 2012 and, in addition to his role as the communications and public affairs specialist, represents Sunnylands on the Rancho Mirage Chamber of Commerce board of directors and volunteers at Safe Schools Desert Cities where he serves as board president. He holds a bachelor’s degree in mass media communications from California State University, San Bernardino.



