Rotary Conference Attendance: Goal = 4 / Achievement will be at Lake Skinner, June 15th.

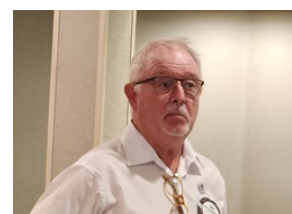
