

MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

PROGRAM Reported by Barbara Lippert

Our presenter was Investigator Aron Wolfe, Project Director, Riverside County Sherriff Department. A 12-year veteran with the County, he works with the Anti-Trafficking Task Force, a collaboration of public and private partnerships who share common goal of locating victims of human trafficking, as well as their traffickers. Aron, with 23 years of police service, opened with a description of the difference between 'sextortion' and 'textation.'

Young girls are taken from Riverside and dropped off at local destinations to be pimped out. The majority of the victims are under 18 and Aron stressed that our children and grandchildren face the danger of trafficking. The trafficking is for labor, sex, and money.

Traffickers are on the internet, social media, and online games and use false profiles to make youth think they are talking to their peers. Since many youths generally wants to fit in and often lack self-confidence, this makes them easy prey for the criminals. The traffickers start making friends convincing them to send nude pictures. Then, they extort the victims for money before making the pictures public. Most of this is done through "catfishing", pretending to be someone else to deceive the victim into wanting a romantic relationship with the criminal. Most youngsters forget to turn off their location history, enabling traffickers to show up at their homes. Parents have been murdered and youth taken for sex.

This talk was both enlightening and scary. As if our teens don't have enough on their plate! In order for these officers to talk to youth at schools, they need to be invited. We are inquiring into our Interact group as well as RYLA regarding presentations in the future.
