Today's Program:

This week's speaker was District Governor Melanie Rice. Melanie shared her very inspirational story of finding her way to Rotary. Clearly a woman of heart and drive, Melanie overcame family obstacles to get her education and teaching credentials before eventually finding her way to owning her own State Farm Brokerage.

Along the way, she continually found ways to help others both within her family and her community. Melanie shared that her first brush with Rotary was not entirely positive. After a local Rotarian invited her to attend a meeting with him, the Rotarian was essentially asked to disinvite her, as women had not yet become members of that particular club. Understandably offended, Melanie turned her significant skills toward helping Olive Crest, another local charity. After a number of successful years with Olive Crest, the charity wound down and Melanie found her way back to Rotary. She notes the irony that the club that once would not allow a woman to attend, now has women members and a woman as District Governor.

Melanie spoke about the event when she truly felt as though she was a Rotarian. It was during a volunteer effort on behalf of the Galilee Center in Mecca. While helping with a massive effort to distribute jeans to members of the community in time for the Day of Epiphany celebration, a young boy standing in the long processional line stopped her and proclaimed her an angel for the work she was doing. This encounter was a touchstone moment in Melanie's as a Rotarian.

We are lucky to have such a kind, smart and dedicated woman leading our

district this year!
