## **This Weeks Program**

This week's speaker was Jeannie Kays, Director at the Palm Springs Library.

A native of Southwest Missouri, Jeannie graduated in 2002 from the University of Washington with a Master's Degree in Library and Information Science. She has lived in the Coachella Valley and worked in area libraries since 2002. Jeannie is the Library Director of the Palm Springs Public Library, where she has served since August of 2012.

March 13th will be a full year since the library was closed due to the pandemic. The staff immediately launched virtual library cards. The library is open to people outside of Palm Springs and is available free of charge.

Pre-pandemic the library offered 300 programs per year. They have moved many of these to a virtual format and the library also has a youtube channel.

The library is still available to check out books. The books are "checked out" in advance and available for pick-up on a table outside the door of the library. Magazines can also be "checked out" virtually and can be checked out for access on your electronic device.

E-books are also available through the library and can be downloaded to your device for replay at a later time, which is particularly handy if you are traveling.

There are also a number of job finding resources available through the library. People can also complete their high school diploma online. The Friends of the Library offer one scholarship (cost is \$1,500 each) and the State will match the same amount to assist students with the cost of the degree. The PS Library has 10 graduates so far.
