This week's speaker was Bob McKechnie, Rotarian and formerly the Director of the Senior Center in Cathedral City. Bob is starting a Rotary E-Club for Peace, World Beyond War.

Attended his first Rotary club meeting in 1965 as a newspaper reporter in Chico, CA, where fines for being late were \$100 and swore he would never join Rotary. In 2017, he was finally convinced to join the club in Cathedral City. That is when he discovered the Rotary Conference for World Peace and attended the Rotary Peace Conference in Ontario, CA.

There he attended a meeting on ending war. This impactful seminar lead to his founding the California Chapter of World Beyond War (worldbeyondwar.org). Californians for a World BEYOND War envision a world where all conflict is successfully resolved in non-violent ways.

Bob compared the thought of ending war with the thought to end slavery and Polio. Both of these these thoughts were unfathomable at a point in time and substantial progress has been made in ridding the world of both. These and so many other advancements began with a single thought that was acted upon.

Bob explained that it is likely that future wars will likely be nuclear war. He then shared a short video describing the effects of even small scale nuclear weapons.

Bob emphasized that "<u>No one is safe until everyone is safe and</u> <u>secure</u>"
