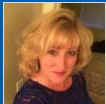

### Speaker of the Week - PDG Helene A. Kalfuss, Ph.D.



Helene is a retired Speech Pathologist who specialized in post-operative head and neck cancer patients, swallowing disorders and organic voice disorders. She earned her Bachelors, Masters and Doctoral degrees at Wayne State University in Detroit and was an Assistant Professor in the College of Medicine and Chief of Audiology and Speech Pathology at the Veterans Administration Hospital in Dearborn, Michigan. On moving to the State of California, she became the Director of the Camarillo State Hospital Children's Speech and Language Clinic and opened a private practice on moving to Palm Springs.

Dr Kalfuss is a past president and member of the Rotary Club of Palm Springs for 25 years and is now a full time Rotarian who frequently speaks on TRF as well as Membership and Literacy. She served as Governor in 2006-2007 and continued to be very active in her district chairing several committees and RI Foundation positions. Her Rotary activities are varied and have allowed her to experience all that Rotary has to offer; she is even a Group Discussion Leader and DGL coordinator at RYLA annually and a facilitator on TRF at the Rotary Leadership Institute.

Helene served for several years as the RI Literacy Resource Coordinator for Zone 26 and as the Assistant Regional Rotary Foundation Coordinator for Zone 26 as well.
