The First Dude of Coronado Rotary, Bill Sandke, introduced Hilda Pacheco-Taylor who told us about President Tami's and Bill Sandke's favorite charity Corazon de Vida. Corazon de Vida supports ten Mexican orphanages serving almost 500 abandoned children. ALL "orphanages" in Mexico are operated privately as the government does not get involved. Ms. Pacheco-Taylor estimated that just in Baja there are over 6000 children living on the streets. Their goals are to SUSTAIN, making sure that the children have food, clothing, shelter, and love. IMPROVE, they provide medical and dental care, and have built a new baby/infant dorm. Finally, the EDUCATE, the children after they're basic needs are met. We met two young ladies, a lawyer and an industrial engineer, who came to the orphanage as six or seven year olds and have graduated college and gone on to productive lives. Corazon de Vida has twenty college graduates and sixty in college. Watch for notices of upcoming events including their gala at the Hotel Del and Rotary's trip to the orphanage and WINERY in October.
