Jeanmarie Bond introduced Rotarian Captain Tim Quast, Commanding Officer of the USNS Mercy. Captain Quast welcomed many of us aboard the USNS Mercy last year, after assuming command in August 2020. He provided an update on a recent humanitarian voyage to Southeast Asia, where he directed the Pacific Partnership 2022, the largest multi-national medical outreach mission in the Indo-Pacific. The ship was in the south Pacific for 150 days, focusing on four lines of effort: Medical, Engineering, Host Nation Outreach and Humanitarian Assistance/Disaster Relief. The countries and locations they visited included The Philippines, Solomon Islands, Palau, and Vietnam. The entire mission cost \$40M, and was well worth it, according to Captain Quast, for the good will and stability it engendered in the region.
