Jeanmarie Bond introduced Dick Fisher who grew up on Alcatraz Island as the son of a prison guard. He grew up in the first "gated community" in California! It opened as a federal prison in 1934 and Dick lived there first in 1936, '37, and '38. They had to go to school by boat to San Francisco! But, there were plenty of kids on the island so they made up their own games which had to do with the wind, roller skates, and spitting! He came back to Alcatraz as a young man in the mid-50s and found dating just as hard as it was going to school in the late-30s. He also shared some of the history of Alcatraz and the cast of characters who were incarcerated there.
