President LuAnn introduced our old friend PDG Steve Brown of the Rotary Club of the Golden Triangle who came by to bring us up to date on their Club's efforts to promote education in Afghanistan. In 2002, following the ouster of the Taliban by US Forces, they built a school in Jalalabad for the purpose of educating boys AND girls. "Rotary Schools" through Afghan Youth Connect have succeeded in educating over 27,000 young Afghani's in 20 years. Post-American pullout Afghan girls cannot go to school past the sixth grade. They competed in four sports, now none. All is not completely lost as it seems that for the most part Rotary Schools fly beneath the radar and while girls still can't go beyond the sixth grade, they at least have access to the computer labs.
