Program

Dan Gensler introduced our stellar panel of financial experts, **Jane Braun, Haley Beard,** and **Rainier Trinidad,** who tried to explain what we should do with our meager funds in 2023. Or, if you don't know who you are, this is an expensive place to find out! Jane has 42 years in the business and her company is Plan to Prosper. She sees the biggest risk as a lack of planning on the part of savers and investors. The opportunities are to take advantage of higher interest rates and the market correction. Rainier's company is Parabolic Financial, and he has 24 years as a portfolio manager. Rainier sees inflation as the greatest risk as once it gets high it stays high longer than one thinks. He believes that the second half of 2023 will be better for equities. Haley represents Edward Jones & Company and agrees that inflation is the greatest risk, especially for the housing market. She sees opportunities in the market correction for prudent investors. They all looking at interest rates in the 4% to 6% range and a second half of 2023 market rise, You could do worse then investing along side any of the three! (Or, four, if one counts Dan!)
