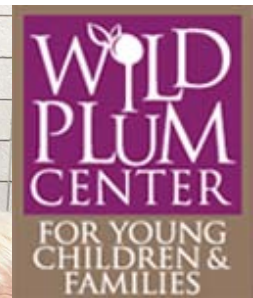

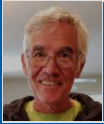

Children enjoy using their fingers and hands to explore their environment! Experimenting with a tugging box provides the opportunity for them to test cause and effect, as well as other scientific theories.

Brown Bear, Brown Bear, What Do You See?

Book and Stick Puppets



Reading with children and retelling stories is one of the best ways to encourage the development of Language and Literacy!

- Incorporate reading into children's bedtime routine.
- Sit on the floor with your child - talk about and describe the pictures you see as you look through the book.
- Use stick puppets while reading Brown Bear to encourage your child's involvement and to make connections.

Areas of Development: Language, Literacy, Social-Emotional, & Cognitive

I-Spy Sensory Bottle



Sensory play is a hands-on way to expose children to the world around them! It encourages children's brains to make important connections.

- Describe and label what is in the bottle. Introduce new vocabulary words as you explore.
- Listen to the sounds the bottle makes.
- Encourage your child to use their hands to manipulate the bottle and look for the items inside.
- Sensory bottles can be extremely calming. If your child is having a hard time regulating their emotions, encourage them to take deep breaths as they look at and move the bottle.

Areas of Development: Language, Social-Emotional, Cognitive, Math, & Fine Motor
