

Pollinator Conservation Webinar Opportunity

As some of you know, a few years ago, Rotary International added Supporting Environment to expand the Areas of Focus to seven. It joins peacebuilding and conflict prevention; disease prevention and treatment; water, sanitation, and hygiene; maternal and child health; basic education and literacy; and community economic development. Rotarians with a common interest in this new focus formed the Environmental Sustainability-Rotary Action Group (ESRAG) to promote projects and educate members and the public. A related subgroup quickly formed, devoted to educating members and the public on the critical symbiotic relationship between pollinators, plants and our food supply around the world.

During a recent Board of Directors meeting, we voted to renew our club's commitment to the Operation Pollination Pollinator Pledge that was signed during Ashley Kasprzak's presidency.
