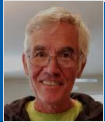

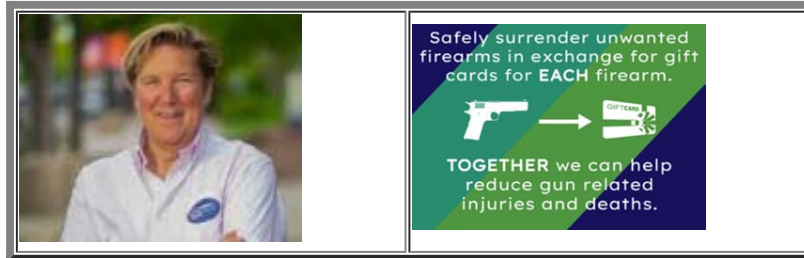

There are some changes coming down the pike in the District 5450 calendar that I wanted to pass along to you.

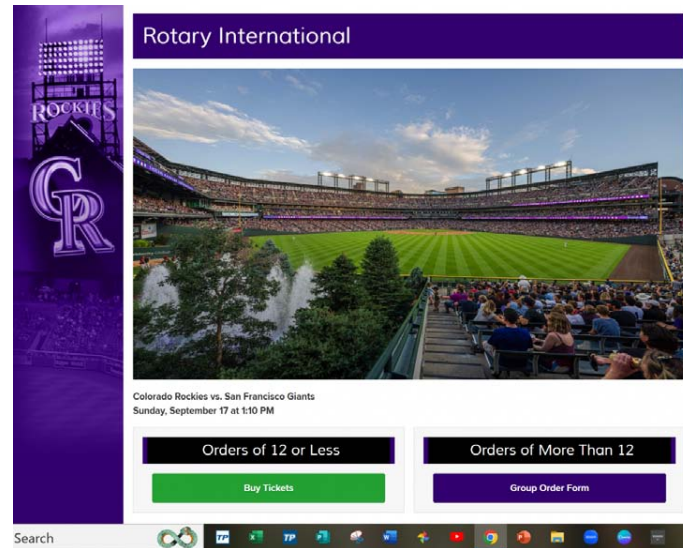
1. The District 5450 Conference is moving from spring to fall. Watch for the new District Convergence on September 30, from 9 am-4 pm at Front Range Community College-Westminster campus. The entire focus of the event will be devoted to developing service projects in our clubs.

2. A new leadership development program is being introduced this fall called RISE, Rotarians Inspired to Succeed and Engage. It's a six-week program starting with an in-person session on September 23 followed by four virtual sessions and a closing in-person session in November. RISE

takes the place of the previous Rotary Leadership Institute, and will be a great way to expand your knowledge of Rotary. Registration opens August 7 and is limited to 25 participants.
