Gardening Together in Khwai

Twin Peaks Rotary will be teaming up with the Rotary Clubs of Longmont and Boulder, as well as District 5450 to provide funding and expertise in the design, development and installation/maintenance of a large garden in Khwai village.

Khwai is on the north bank of the [Khwai River](#) in the [North-West District](#) of [Botswana](#). The river is the northern boundary of the [Moremi Game Reserve](#), and the village is just outside the north gate of the reserve, which is on the eastern side of the [Okavango Delta](#).

The village has a population of approximately 400 BaBukakhwe or [River Bushmen](#). Most of the inhabitants are Babukakhwe but some are [Bayei](#) as well.



This is the primary school in the village and some village children at play.

The village leaders are concerned about the lack of nutrition and lack of healthy choices for the community and feel that this garden program will have a positive impact on the health and well-being of Khwai village. The plot behind the village primary school is quite sufficient to serve as a garden area for the community and further to serve as an inspiration for other such gardens to spring up, for example, at the secondary school.

FYI: The people of Khwai are developing an [eco-tourism](#) and sustainable development program to conserve the area's unique environment. They are building a community run [safari](#) organization as part of Botswana's [community based natural resource management](#) program. Numerous lodges and safari camps surround the village.
