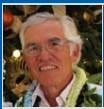

Stacey Putka, Co-Founder and Executive Director of Denver based, Guidestar GOLD rated non-profit Breakthrough Alliance of Colorado will speak about “Reducing Recidivism in Colorado”



Over the past decade, Colorado’s recidivism rate has averaged 45%. It’s unacceptable that 45% of persons released from our prisons are **back in prison within three years**.

Breakthrough exists to transform the lives of people with criminal histories and the communities perception of the incarcerated population. Stacey Putka, will speak about how YOU can come alongside them in their mission and break down barriers for our returning neighbors. Breakthrough is challenging old limitations and outdated perceptions, inspiring people who’ve been incarcerated to embrace new possibilities. Those who’ve enrolled in Breakthrough’s “The Challenge” programs have a stunningly low 6% reincarceration rate and a 92% employment rate.

The good news is that six Rotary Clubs have joined the Boulder Rotary initiated \$25,000 District Grant D24-007 “Reducing Recidivism in Colorado” by supporting Breakthrough.

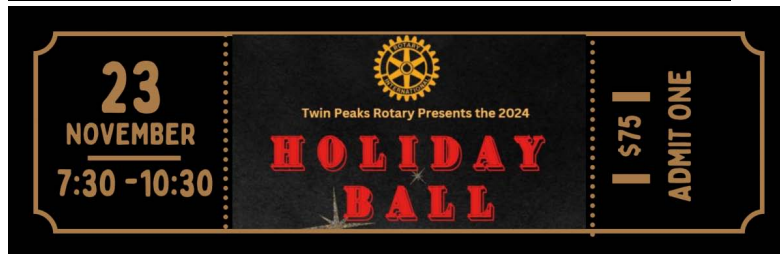

Ticket Captains Needed!



Hello Twin Peaks Rotary Club members.

Skipper Schack here.

We are just 5 weeks away from the 2024 Holiday Ball and we still need a few more Ticket Captains who will commit to selling 10 Holiday Ball tickets. Some folks I've talked with are concerned about how they could sell 10 tickets.

Here is an idea one of our Ticket Captains gave me that might put those kind of concerns in the proper perspective and make the job a lot easier:

"To help out the Holiday Ball cause I have agreed to do my part and be a Ticket Captain, committing to sell 10 Holiday Ball tickets at \$75 each. To help out the club and to ensure the fundraising success of this year's Holiday Ball, I decided to write a check for \$750 for my 10 tickets up front (I understand that I could have put the \$750 on my credit card if I wanted to). That way, the Ball has the money for the 10 tickets right away and now I have a little bit more personal motivation to get my 10 tickets sold and recoup some or all the money I've already laid out.

So, here's just one example of how to help and how easy it can be.

If you are willing to be a Ticket Captain, please let me know. You can pay for the tickets in advance as the Ticket Captain writing above has done, or you can pay as you sell them.

Either way, the club needs your help to make the 2024 Holiday Ball as successful as it can be as we raise funds for Charity Fund Inc and all its good works.
