Dr. Michael Lokale is a family medicine physician in Oro Valley, AZ and has over 10 years of experience in the medical field. He was recommended to speak to our club by his patients and Oro Valley Rotary Club members Rick and Rianne Chimbleo. And as it turns out, he is the doctor to a number of our club members!

Dr. Lokale and his siblings were raised by their mother after his father was tragically killed in a raid on their village. He left Kenya after high school to attend the Virginia Military Institute, where he graduated with a degree in Biology and Chemistry. He pursued graduate school in England, where he earned a Master's degree in cardiac physiology as a Rhodes Scholar at the University of Oxford. He then attended Virginia College of Osteopathic Medicine.

Weekly Trader Joe's Food Pickup for IMPACT of So. AZ

It is hard to believe, but children and their families in Tucson go to bed hungry. In fact, the Community Food Bank of Southern Arizona serves more than 18,000 people in Pima County every month, with a 30% increase in need over the holidays. For the last eight years, the Rotary Club of Oro Valley, along with Interact students, have gone to Trade Joe's every Saturday morning to pick up food for the IMPACT Community Food Bank - an estimated 26,000 lbs of food per year.
