Guest Speaker

Kathy Schrenk is a local author who gave a very insightful presentation today on the history of Kirkwood. She recently published a new book titled "Kirkwood – A Walk Through the Streets." The Kirkwood community was founded in the 1850s, triggered by the installation of the Pacific Railroad depot. James Kirkwood was the engineer who routed the railroad through the area and decided to place a station there. The Kirkwood community developed around the station. St. Louis City dwellers purchased "bedroom homes" in the area and rode the train from downtown to the "country." The

Kirkwood community is a microcosm of the United States: its transition from a "bedroom community" for City residents to an independent, thriving City, its annexation of the Meacham Park community in the 1990s, and its population growth. Kathy described the former Meramec Highlands Complex, complete with a hotel, dance hall and beach. Records reflect nine trains coming from Downtown St. Louis to the Complex each day. We really enjoyed listening to Kathy's talk and thank her for coming to our meeting.
