Guest Speakers

Recent Speaker

Lisa Hill from the Osage Beach Senior Center spoke to the group about the activities and services the center provides for individuals 60 years and older. The center is located adjacent to the Hope Lutheran church on West Osage Beach Parkway.

A lot of their services have been on hold since the outbreak of Covid 19. They hope to be returning to those activities in the near future with many residents receiving the vaccine.

Pre-Covid, they provided about 50 meals a day to seniors in our community. They also had activities such as men's poker, canasta and bridge. It was the card games that brought many people to the center. They also have a TV, books and fireplace where seniors could come to enjoy so they had a place to go. Socialization is an important aspect of our lives and these amenities and services provided that for many people. They did ask for a \$4 donation for meals but if someone was unable to pay they did not turn them away. Often other attendees paid for those that did not have the funds. The goal of the Senior Center is to provide nutritional meals and socialization to seniors so that they could stay in their homes longer.

They also have about 20 seniors on their home-bound list that they delivery a week's worth of meals, consisting of seven frozen meals: not TV dinners as the meals are prepared by a dietitian. They would also provide milk, juice and fresh fruit. The cost for this service is \$20 per week. They are always looking for volunteers to help with delivery.

Since the pandemic, they are still doing the home bound meals, but the activities have been on hold and they are only doing curbside meal service. Approximately 20 meals are being served each day curb side.

They also deliver Christmas care packages and are looking to start a new program that would provide vouchers for farmer's markets and pet food delivery.

The center is funded through grants, donations and fundraising events. They were very much appreciative of our clubs recent \$600 donation. Again, they are always looking for volunteers so if you have time on your hands, please contact the Osage Beach Senior Center

In the fifth century at the age of 16, Patrick was captured by Irish pirates from his home in Britain and taken as a slave to Ireland, looking after animals. He lived there for six years before escaping and returning to his family. After becoming a cleric, he returned to northern and western Ireland. In later life, he served as a bishop. By the seventh century, he had already come to be revered as the patron saint of Ireland. Saint Patrick's Day is observed on 17 March, the supposed date of his death. It is celebrated inside and outside Ireland as a religious and cultural holiday.
