

My name is Irelyn Meckley, and I am currently a senior at Camdenton High School. My family and I have lived at the Lake of the Ozarks for the past four

years, since my father retired from his 20 year career in the United States Army. While at Camdenton, I have participated in a number of extracurricular activities as well as community service organizations including: National Honor Society, Key Club, Science Research, LASER 3284 Robotics, Girles Swim Team, A+ Program, and Girles Track and Field. Some of my favorite school activities have been my participation in the science research program and the Lady Laker swim team. I have been accepted into the Aerospace Engineering Program at the Georgia Institute of Technology, beginning in the fall of 2021.
